category

- There are four key different functions of technical document: tutorials, how-to guides, explanation and technical reference.
- each of them requires a distinct mode of writing

Category

TUTORIALS

A tutorial:

- is **learning-oriented**
- allows the newcomer to get started
- is a lesson

Analogy: teaching a small child how to cook

HOW-TO GUIDES

A how-to guide:

- is **goal-oriented**
- shows how to solve a specific problem
- is a series of steps

Analogy: a recipe in a cookery book

EXPLANATION

An explanation:

- is **understanding-oriented**
- explains
- provides background and context

Analogy: an article on culinary social history

REFERENCE

A reference guide:

- is **information-oriented**
- describes the machinery
- is accurate and complete

Analogy: a reference encyclopaedia article

How to write good tutorial

- allow the user to learn by doing
- get the user started
 - The point of a tutorial is to get your learner started on their journey, not to get them to a final destination.
- make sure your tutorial works
- repeatable
- focus on concrete steps, not abstract concepts
- provide minimum necessary explanation

requirement of how-to guide

- a list of steps, followed in order
- focus on results
- solve a problem
- don't explain concepts
- allow for some flexibility

Reference guides

Information oriented

- structure the documentation around the code
- be consistent
- do nothing but describe
- be accurate

explanation

understanding oriented

- provide context
- discuss alternatives and opinions
- do not instruct , or provide technical reference
 - Explanation should do things that the other parts of the documentation do not.
